what we do



MARKETS

We advocate for fair, transparent domestic markets and improved access across Australian states while respecting biosecurity. We work to improve export market access and protocols. In collaboration with the Australian government, we've secured access to New Zealand, China, South Korea, and the USA, and improved access to Japan. We're also working with DAFF to improve phytosanitary protocols.

We manage orchard and packhouse registrations for protocol markets and coordinate international inspector visits with DAFF and industry partners.



We help guide the direction of research through our strong professional relationships with researchers across Australia and membership of Hort Innovation's Mango Strategic Industry Advisory Panel.

We actively seek to identify and build research networks to enhance industry knowledge.





NEWS & EVENTS

We bring the mango industry together through key events such as the pre-season roadshows and the Australian Mango Conference. These gatherings provide valuable opportunities for sharing insights, and staying up to date with the latest industry developments.

Throughout the year, we also keep the industry informed and connected with our Mango Matters magazine (quarterly), weekly emails during the season, and monthly updates in the off-season.

LABOUR

We advocate for access to secure, reliable and productive seasonal labour force.



QUALITY

We offer NIR Dry Matter Testing in the weeks leading up to harvest.

CROP PROTECTION

We provide up-to-date information on registered agrichemicals and crop protection strategies for growers and agronomists.

We maintain and update the list of MRL's for agrichemicals for Australian and key export markets.

In partnership with Hort Innovation, we help secure minor use permits by identifying industry priorities, supporting applications and advocating to agrichemical companies, ensuring growers have access to essential products not otherwise available.

BIOSECURITY

As one of the first plant industries to be a signatory to the Emergency Plant Pest Response Deed, we ensured commercial mango growers would be in the best position possible to gain reimbursement in the event of an approved response to an exotic pest incursion.

We advocate for stronger enforcement of interstate plant movement and increased border surveillance.

We are developing regional production maps showing mango orchards and known 'feral' trees. These maps will be critical in understanding potential pest spread and guiding effective responses during an exotic pest incursion.

We provide best practice biosecurity resources to help reduce the risk of the spread of pests and diseases.

CROP FORECASTING & DISPATCH INFORMATION

Each season, we work with growers to forecast regional yields for key mango varieties. These forecasts support businesses through the supply chain with marketing, logistics, while helping transport companies manage crop flow during the peak season.



RESOURCES

We maintain a comprehensive and ever-evolving library of best practice resources on our website to support a productive, profitable and sustainable mango industry. Behind the scenes, we work closely with experts and project partners to translate research into practical tools and guidance.

TRADE

We advocate for workable trade movement protocols across state and territory borders that provide protection from regionally important pests but are the least restrictive.

FAQ's

Q. I pay mango levies, does that mean I am an AMIA member?

A. No. AMIA is a not-for-profit member organisation. While all commercial mango growers pay levies on mangoes sent to the fresh market (domestic and export), AMIA members pay a separate membership fee directly to AMIA.

Q. Does AMIA get my levies?

A. Not directly. AMIA participates in a competitive tender process to access levy funding and manage R&D projects offered by Hort Innovation. AMIA only applies for projects when they feel they are best placed to manage these projects. AMIA provides a stable business structure, a regionally based team of skilled staff and a Board of grower directors with oversight to enable sound representation of industry and to ensure projects are aligned to industry needs.

Q. I already pay levies and receive information from AMIA. Why pay for membership?

A. It is true you will see some benefits as a levy payer because AMIA manages the administration of projects funded by your levies managed by Hort Innovation (e.g. the Communication project delivers Mango Matters and My Mango).

Your membership gives AMIA the ability to work effectively on your behalf on the range of issues outside specific levy funded projects. Levy funds cannot be used for advocacy purposes, so some of the work we undertake on your behalf is funded from other sources, including membership fees.
